Ground Rules for Meetings

1. Show up on time and come prepared

Be prompt in arriving at the meeting and in returning from breaks.

Be prepared to contribute to achieving the meeting goals.

2. Stay mentally and physically present

Be present, and don't attend non-meeting business.

Talk one at a time, waiting to be recognized by the chairperson.

Limit side conversations.

Turn cell phones off or to vibrate only. If it's an urgent call take it outside.

3. Let everyone participate

Share time so that all can participate.

Be patient when listening to others speak and do not interrupt them.

Respect and value all contributions.

Wait to be acknowledged by the chairperson before talking. The Sergeant at Arms or Vice President will enforce the Ground Rules for meetings and Code of Conduct.

4. Listen with an open mind

Appreciate the value of differing opinions.

Stay open to new ways of doing things.

It's OK to disagree, respectfully and openly, and without being disrespectful.

5. Attack the problem, not the person

Respectfully challenge the idea, not the person.

Honest and constructive discussions are necessary to get the best results.

Address any concerns about the discussion or the meeting with the Chairperson. It is the Chairperson's job to bring the meeting to order.
